

STONINGTON BOARD OF EDUCATION SPECIAL MEETING June 7, 2012

Gail MacDonald, Chairwoman, called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. in the Stonington High School Commons. Members present were Deborah Downie, Alisa Morrison, Frank Todisco, and Kevin Bornstein.

Absent: Faith Leitner, Secretary, and Craig Esposito

Also present were Leanne Masterjoseph, Superintendent of Schools, Ana de Oliveira, Recording Secretary, members of the staff, students and interested citizens.

Comments from Citizens

Jim Turner spoke on behalf of the Magnet School parents and asked the Board to reconsider the reduction of the transportation to out of town Magnet Schools.

Sue Jones commented on the reduction of HS Athletic Allocations and the reduction of extra-curricular stipends while suggesting that these dollars be taken from budget lines 620, 720 and 730. Sue added that she would rather see equipment purchases be postponed instead of cutting coaches.

Gail MacDonald thanked Bill King, Judy Samokar and Leanne Masterjoseph for providing the Board with a lot of information this past week, especially once the budget was passed.

Gail MacDonald noted that she received a great deal of information from the legal counsel and based on this information the Board will be making its decision on the list of item recommendations from administration.

Possible Budget Approval

Gail MacDonald asked the Board for suggestions on the reduction of the budget. The Board followed with discussion on the reduction of the budget.

The following motion was made by Kevin Bornstein and seconded by Gail MacDonald.

Motion 1: To accept submission as given with the exception of 0.4 FTE World Language (French) SHS and 0.5 FTE IT Tech reductions.

The Board discussed this motion.

Motion amended by Kevin Bornstein and seconded by Gail MacDonald to reinstate \$44,500 from the list by identifying:

0.4 FTE World Language -	\$19,350
0.4 FTE MMS Psychologist -	\$19,350
Summer Academy -	\$ 5,400
Supplies related to Summer Academy -	\$ 400

A reduction of (\$664) will be added to the HS Athletic Allocations and HS Co-curricular Allocations proportionally.(see attached)

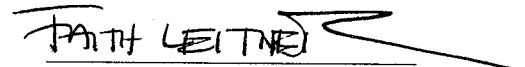
Sue Jones asked if there would be a cost savings in the hiring of a new superintendent.
