Farouk Rajab, Board Chairman called the regular meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Members present were Chris Donahue, Sara Baker, Dan Kelley, Craig Esposito. Attended Virtually - Heidi Simmons, Secretary. Member Absent: Kevin Agnello. Also present were Mary Anne Butler, Superintendent of Schools; Student Government Representative, Diya Patel; Recording Secretary, Ana de Oliveira and members of the administration staff and citizens.

Communications & Recognitions

Mary Anne Butler, Superintendent recognized Deidre Toole, special education teacher who awarded the first ever Just one Chance Award to the Mystic Aquarium for their current and past contributions to Stonington Public Schools students for providing inclusive learning and employment opportunities for them. 

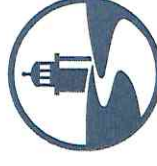

1.1d Empowered Learner

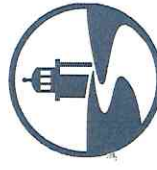

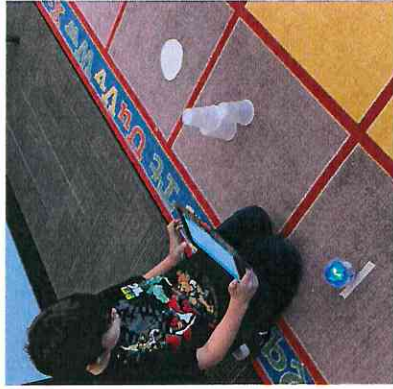

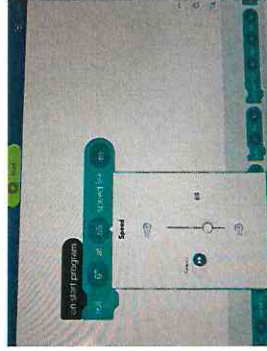

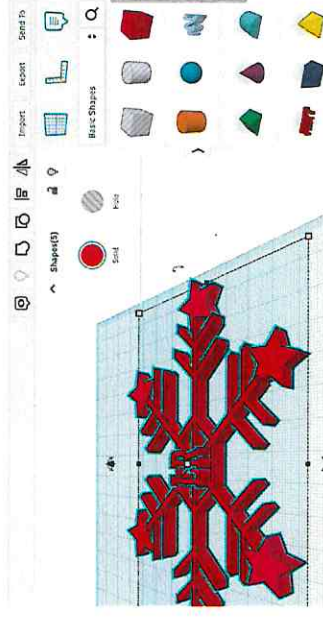
