AP Psychology Summer Assignments 2023

Welcome to AP Psychology! I am certain that you will find this course fascinating and personally relevant. Please note, AP Psychology is an elective, college-level course with <u>higher expectations</u> than most courses taken by high school students.

Consequently, it is important that we get a jumpstart on the AP Psychology curriculum. It is <u>mandatory</u> and in your best interest to complete these summer assignments. Each assignment will serve a specific purpose that will assist you throughout the school year and aid in your preparation for the AP Exam in May.

Assignment #1 - "Myers Chapters 1 & 2" (Due on Tuesday, 8/29)

CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.RH.11-12.2 - Determine the central ideas or information of a primary or secondary source; provide an accurate summary that makes clear the relationships among the key details and ideas.

Research demonstrates that our brains are better able to retrieve information which has been organized into meaningful units or structures. A technique called "chunking," for example, allows our brains to recall "(860) 599-5781" more easily than "8605995781," or "ROY G. BIV" more easily than "red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet." Another technique - *taking text notes in outline format* - organizes information in such a way that our brains can store it *hierarchically*.

On GoogleClassroom, you have received copies of "Outline 1A: Psychology's History and Approaches" and "Outline 1B: Research Methods: Thinking Critically with Psychological Science." Using your copy of our Myers' Psychology for AP textbook, please complete these two digital chapter outlines. Please click "Turn-in" when finished with each.

These outlines (in combination with the numerous others you will complete throughout the year) will serve as valuable study tools as you prepare for our tests/quizzes and the AP Exam in May.
