PROMOTING READING FOR OUR STUDENTS

The first week of March marks our annual reading week at Deans Mill School. This year's theme is DMS Reads Across Stonington. The week will be filled with a variety of fun and engaging activities that relate to our local community. Some of the week's activities for students will include: a school-wide "Read In", a Book Buddies meet up with another class, a visit from Community Readers, door decorating, and a Stonington Gallery Walk around the building. Our 5th Grade students will be participating in a discussion with a Stonington High School Senior who is illustrating and publishing a children's book called Phantom's Journey, about a local therapy dog. While we promote literacy and reading regularly, the purpose of the week is to increase our students' passion for reading.

The reading skills our students develop during elementary school will serve them through adulthood. Here are strategies you could implement at home to help your child develop his/her reading skills:



- Make reading a part of every day. Even a few minutes a day can make a difference.
- ightharpoons Read to your child and read with your child.
- Serve as a role model. Give your child opportunities to see you enjoy reading.
- Visit the library. Get your child a library card and make regular visits to the library a fun experience.
- Limit screen time.
- Give your child a choice. Present a variety of books to your child that are the right level, length, and type for your child and let them choose.
- if your child is an impatient reader, choose books that have movement.
- If your child has trouble reading, help choose stories that he/she can relate to.
- Reading well is about understanding meaning, not just knowing how to say the words
- Give books and magazine subscriptions as gifts.

Our goal for the year is to keep families informed about grade level curriculum in Art, Library, 5th Grade Band, Music, and Physical Education, and how they can support their children at home.

Fourth grade students have been busy learning about value and form. We are currently working on creating dragon eyes. We compared pictures of dragons from renaissance paintings and Chinese tapestries to find similarities and differences. We could see that the attitudes towards dragons changed drastically between Eastern and Western cultures. Each student could choose how he or she wanted his or her dragon to look. We used different shades of watercolor paint in the center of the eye to make it appear as if the round eyes were spherical. Value is one of the most effective ways to create the illusion of form on a flat surface.

Fourth graders are hard at work getting ready for the spring concert in April. and are looking forward to demonstrating their recorder skills! So far students have learned pitches B, A, G, and E on the recorder. They have played some familiar songs such as "Hot Cross Buns" and "Rain, Rain." We are currently working on singing and playing our recorders in a 2-part canon on the song, "Who Has Seen the Wind?" And as always, we continue to work to make beautiful sounds on the recorder by completely covering the holes with our fingers, using "warm, soft air," and "tonguing" the notes "doo" (articulation).

Scoliosis Screening

Scoliosis screening will be performed on April 30, 2020 for Deans Mill School 5th Grade Female Students

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The State of Connecticut mandates that school nurses conduct postural screenings for female students in grades 5 and 7 and male students in grade 8. School nurses will be performing this screening during the months of March and April.

The purpose of this program is to recognize the signs of spinal curvature at its earliest stages so that the need for treatment can be determined. Specifically, scoliosis is a sideways curvature of the spine. In its early years, it is painless and develops gradually, especially during the years of rapid adolescent growth. Kyphosis, sometimes called round back, is an exaggerated forward bend of the spine and is often confused with poor posture. Many cases of curvature of the spine are mild and require only ongoing observation by a doctor after the first diagnosis. Others get progressively more severe as the child grows and requires active treatment. Early treatment can prevent the development of a severe deformity which can affect a person's appearance and health.

Each student will be screened individually by school nurses. The nurses will inspect the student's spine as he or she stands and then bends forward. The student's entire back from shoulders to hips need to be observed without covering. Boys will be required to remove shirts. Girls should be observed wearing a two-piece bathing suit top or bra.

If further consultation is recommended, parents will be notified in writing of the findings and will be asked to seek further evaluation from their own physician.

Registration will be by appointment and will take approximately <u>30 minutes</u> to complete.

Children <u>don't need</u> to be present at the time of registration.

Eligibility

A child must be five years old on or before January 1, 2021

Law requires students to register for school by age 6. If you are unsure about your child's readiness for kindergarten, feel free to contact DMS Principal, Jennifer McCurdy (imccurdy@stoningtonschools.org) or WVSS Principal, Alicia Dawe (adawe@stoningtonschools.org) to discuss enrollment options.

To register*, you MUST bring the following:


- 1. ___ **Proof of Residency** (All 3 listed below):
 - SIGNED LEASE AGREEMENT OR MORTGAGE
 - CURRENT UTILITY BILL (ELECTRIC, PHONE, CABLE)
 - DRIVER'S LICENSE/CAR REGISTRATION
- 2. ___ Child's birth certificate or passport
- 3. ___ Legal guardianship papers (if applicable)
- 4. Custody papers (if applicable)
- 5. ___ Kindergarten Health Assessments (Physical Exam): Please bring documentation of the MOST RECENT PHYSICAL with you to registration. All Kindergarten Physicals must be completed between January 1st and Dec 31st of the calendar year the child starts school. If the exam was done prior to January 1st, entry to school is accepted until a new physical exam is completed one year from the date of the last physical to remain compliant in school.
- 6. ___ Immunizations Records- documentation of the most recent immunization records
- 7. **Lead screening results:** Universal blood lead testing is mandated in CT. Children are tested between 9 months and 36 months of age. Proof of testing is required prior to the start of school. This should be documented on the physical exam form.
- 8. ___ Health related questions can be discussed with the school nurse at registration.

*Class placement will not be available until all registration requirements are met.


