

# Parking Procedures

The map below outlines our parking procedures for the 2019 - 2020 school year. Please pay careful attention to the flow of traffic as safety is our top priority!



- Kiss and Drop (AM only) For those families who transport their child(ren) to school in the morning, please enter the Kiss and Drop entrance. Pull your car up to the "stop to unload" area and have your child exit the car (on the sidewalk side). A staff member will be stationed at the sidewalk to take your child into the school building. Parents should only unload if they are the first 4 cars. If you need to enter the building or exit your car, it is important to park in a parking spot. \* Never drop a child unless there is a staff member present to receive him or her. Staff members are at the Kiss and Drop from 8:40 AM until 8:55 AM. Students should not be dropped off prior to 8:40 AM.
- **Bus Loop (AM & PM)** We have a separate entrance for buses. Please note that no cars are allowed to enter the bus area.
- Parent Pick-Up (PM) If your child is a parent pick-up, please park in the Parent/Visitor Parking. Parents will enter the school through the side cafeteria door. The cafeteria doors will be opened by the staff with dismissal duty at 3:25 pm. (Please note that parents/guardians will need to wait outside until 3:25 pm). Once the doors are unlocked, parents/guardians will form 2 lines and wait behind the tables in the entryway of the cafeteria and will present a photo ID and sign children out. You will receive a sticker indicating the child you are picking up. Children will be escorted by a staff member to their parent/guardian. Parents will exit the school with their child(ren) through the side doors. Please note, due to school safety, no parent will be allowed into the school beyond the sign in table. If you need to enter the school for any reason (ie. bathrooms, lockers, nurse, office) you must go to the main entrance and sign in.

# Deans Mill School Back-to-School Night Wednesday, September 18, 2019



Back-to-School Night is an evening for parents and child(ren) to:

- Meet your child's teacher.
- Learn about a "typical" day.
- Be informed about curricular and social expectations.
- Tour the new facility at DMS.

Many parents and staff have shared feedback that they would like students to be part of this evening. In order to accommodate this request, we kindly ask that only immediate family and students attend Back-to-School Night so that rooms are not overcrowded. We ask that children remain with their parents at all times.

### Grades 1, 2, & 3: 5:00 P.M. - 6:00 P.M.

**Grades 1, 2, & 3 families**: report directly to your child's classroom at **5:00 P.M.** Your child's classroom teacher will make a brief presentation about grade level expectations and curriculum. Grade 3 families, you will also have time to visit your child's other classroom teacher.

### Grades 4 & 5: 6:45 P.M. - 7:45 P.M.

**Grades 4 & 5 families:** report directly to your child's homeroom class at **6:45 P.M.** Your child's classroom teacher will make a brief presentation about grade level expectations and curriculum. Time will be given for you to visit your child's other classroom teacher.

After visiting your child's classroom, please be sure to visit our Special Area teachers who will be in their classrooms.



We recognize that parking is limited. Due to parking restrictions, the evening will be divided into two sessions. We ask you to park responsibly, keeping fire lanes clear, and to arrive/exit the building at the assigned times for your child's grade level.

If possible, we ask that families arrive in one car!



Since Kindergarten Orientation was held just prior to the start of the school year, and Kindergarten parents had an opportunity to conference with teachers during the first three days of school, Kindergarten staff will not participate in Back-to-School Night. If you require more information about Kindergarten, please contact your child's teacher. He or she will be happy to help!

Reading Specialists, School Psychologists, Special Education teachers, and other school staff members will be in the building throughout the evening.


### Kindergarten, First Grade, and Second Grade •

### Nurse's Notes



#### **Snacks**

Please find *healthy* and *safe* snacks on the downloadable safe snack link at <u>snacksafely.com</u>.



### **Injuries, Illnesses & Absences**

Please report illness, injury, and travel out of country to the nurse.

Injuries that need accommodations require a doctor's note. If your child has a fever or GI symptoms, please refer to the "24-hour rule" and keep your child home until symptom-free (without the use of medication) for 24 hours. Let the nurse know if your child has the flu, strep, or another communicable disease.

Please be sure to share any medical changes or information with the nurse.

### **Medical Excuses**

A written note from the child's medical provider is required for students to be excused from physical education class. If a student has an MD note that excludes him/her from PE, this excludes both PE and activities at recess. A follow-up note from the MD is necessary to release student from this restriction. Use of the elevator and crutches requires a written note by the medical provider.

### **Change of Clothes** (including sneakers)

Students in **all grades** should have a change of clothing (shirt, pants, undergarments, socks) to be kept in their lockers. Milk spills! Thank you.

#### **Lice Prevention**

The following are steps that can be taken to help prevent and control the spread of head lice:

- Avoid head-to-head (hair-to-hair) contact during play and other activities at home, school, and elsewhere (sports activities, playground, slumber parties, camp).
- Do not share clothing such as hats, scarves, coats, sports uniforms, hair ribbons, or barrettes.
- Do not share combs, brushes, or towels.

For a complete list of prevention tips, please see the <u>CDC guidelines</u> on lice prevention.

### **Screenings**

Annual vision, hearing and scoliosis screenings will be done in school as mandated by the State of CT. Parents will be notified if further evaluation is needed. Vision screenings are required for grades K-5. Hearing screenings are required for grades K-5. Scoliosis (postural screening) is required for girls in 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade and boys in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Vision and Hearing screenings will begin in October. If you have any concerns about your child's vision or hearing, please contact the nurse.

Please reach out to the nurse at any time that you have a medical question or concern. We are here to help keep your child safe, healthy, and in school!




